EU programme for Education, Training, Youth and Sport (2014-2020)

What are the challenges in school education?

- Reinforcing the development of key competences
- Strengthening the profile of the teaching professions
- Promoting a comprehensive approach to language teaching and learning
- Increasing the levels of achievement and interest in STEM
- Tackling early school leaving and disadvantage
- Reinforcing quality in early childhood education and care
- Building capacity for promoting and facilitating recognition of learning periods abroad



What can Erasmus+ offer your school?

Activities offered to schools (decentralised actions)

Learning Mobility of Individuals (KA1)

- **School Education Staff Mobility (KA101)**
Professional development opportunities for staff, including teaching, training and job-shadowing abroad

Strategic partnership (KA2)

- **School Exchange Partnerships (KA229)**
International pupil exchanges and study experiences, plus staff training and teaching assignments overseas
- **Strategic Partnerships for School Education (KA201)**
Collaborative projects with international partners to improve education provision and share innovative practices. 2 types of partnerships:
 - Strategic Partnerships supporting innovation
 - Strategic Partnerships supporting exchange of good practices





Before getting started...

Who is who in the Erasmus+ world



European Commission (EC)

- Manages the E+ budget
- Organises the calls for proposals
- Sets the priorities, targets and criteria for E+
- Monitors the general implementation of E+ at a European level



National Agencies (NA)

- Provide information on E+
- Administers the selection process for project applications in their country
- Provide support to project holders throughout the project's lifecycle
- Monitor and evaluate the implementation of E+ in their country
- Collaborate with the EC and other NAs



Participating organisations

In KA1:

- Applicant organisation
- Sending organisation
- Receiving organisation

In KA2:

- Min. of 3 organisations from 3 different Programme Countries

In KA2 School Exchange Partnership:

- Only 2 schools from 2 different Programme Countries



Entering the Erasmus+ world!

Things to know before preparing your application

You should have a:

- a **concrete project idea**, agreed on and supported by all those who will contribute to it in your school and, if applicable, your partner organisations;
- a **good knowledge of the Erasmus+ Key Action** you intend to apply for – particularly its objectives and its formal requirements (also known as the **eligibility criteria**);
- a unique identifier called **Organisation ID** (formerly known as Participant Identification Code) – referred to as the OID number; please make sure your project partners, if applicable, also have it (organisations that have already participated in decentralised actions will not have to register again).



Developing your whole-school approach

European activities as an integral part of development planning within the school



Practical tips

- 1) Formulate the application from the **point of view of your school** (or consortium).
- 2) **Be precise**, explain concepts and ideas.
- 3) Make sure your proposal is **coherent, concrete and clear** to a reader.
- 4) Support your statements with **facts and figures**, and use examples.
- 5) Demonstrate a **realistic timeframe** and explain your **working methodology**.
- 6) Think about how you plan on produce **concrete and sustainable results**.
- 7) Explain how you will **let other people know about your project**.
- 8) Give your draft proposal to a colleague **for review**.

Completing and submitting a proposal

Erasmus+ official application form

- Specific data in proper fields
- Eligibility requirements
- Mandatory attachments
- Page limits



Assessment process of your proposal



1. Eligibility

- Formal requirements



2. Quality

Award criteria:

- Relevance
- Project design and implementation
- Project team and the cooperation arrangements (only for KA2)
- Impact and dissemination




3. Ranking

- Selection of as many top-ranked proposals as the budget can fund

Deadlines (decentralised actions)

- For KA1 applications: **5 February 2020**
- For KA2 applications: **24 March 2020**
